The Municipality of Clarington has initiated an application to amend the Zoning By-law to remove the exception zone permitting an automotive auction on the former Manheim's Auto Auction lands in Courtice. The automotive auction use has ceased and with work being done for the future 401 – 418 interchange, the building has been demolished. The purpose of the rezoning is to eliminate the exception zone which permits a use that no longer exists and retain the balance of the permitted uses consistent with Clarington's Official Plan and Provincial policy.




Retail Outlet Centre Proposed for south Bowmanville
